

A PENNY FOR YOUR THOUGHTS? WHAT IS THE FUTURE OF THE COPPER COIN?

or over two centuries, the U.S. penny has been a staple of American currency, featuring the face of Abraham Lincoln since 1909. However, as digital payments and rising production costs make small-denomination coins less relevant, many wonder whether the penny will soon become a relic of the past. With increasing calls to discontinue the one-cent coin, the

The Cost of Making a Penny

One of the biggest arguments against keeping the penny in circulation is its cost. The U.S. Mint currently spends more to produce a penny than its actual face value. As of 2023, it cost about 2.72 cents to mint

debate over its future remains a hot topic.

a single penny—nearly three times its worth. This means that producing pennies is a financial burden on the government and, ultimately, taxpayers.

The main reason for the high cost is the price of the materials used in minting. Modern pennies are made of 97.5% zinc and 2.5% copper, and fluctuations in metal prices have only increased the cost of production. Critics argue that eliminating the penny could save millions of dollars annually.

Public Sentiment: Nostalgia vs. Practicality

Despite its declining use, the penny holds sentimental value for many Americans. It has been a part of the nation's history since

1793, and the idea of eliminating it feels like erasing a piece of tradition. Some also fear that getting rid of the penny could result in retailers rounding up prices, effectively leading to a small but

cumulative increase in every-day expenses.

However, studies show that rounding prices to the nearest nickel would likely have a neutral effect, with some purchases rounding up and others rounding down. Countries like Canada, Australia, and New

Zealand have already phased out their lowest-denomination coins without significant economic consequences.

What Would Happen Without the Penny?

If the penny were discontinued, cash transactions would likely be rounded to the nearest nickel, as is the case in countries that have removed their smallest coins. The U.S. has already seen similar strategies during coin shortages, with businesses rounding prices when exact change wasn't available.

In digital transactions, eliminating the penny would have virtually no impact since prices are charged exactly as listed, without rounding. In fact, given that most transactions today are electronic, many argue that pennies are increasingly irrelevant in a

digital economy.

Government and Legislative Efforts

Discussions about eliminating the penny have surfaced multiple times in Congress,

but so far, no serious action has been

taken. The Penny Save Act,

introduced in previous years, proposed halting penny

production as a cost-saving measure, but it did not gain enough support. The main opponents of discontinuation include penny manufacturers and industries that rely on cash transactions, such as vending machines and laundromats.

Still, the U.S. Mint has acknowledged that maintaining the penny is expensive and has explored alternative solutions, such as reducing production costs by using cheaper materials. However, no major changes have been implemented yet.

The Future of the Penny

While there is growing momentum to eliminate the penny, it remains in production for now. However, as cash usage declines and production costs rise, the push to phase out the penny may become harder to ignore. If other countries' experiences are any indication, eliminating the penny may be a matter of when—not if. For now, the penny endures, but its future remains uncertain. Will the U.S. Mint continue making pennies for years to come, or will they finally be deemed obsolete?

IAST BEATER By Danielle Sams

routine deep-sea diving mission in the North Sea goes terribly wrong when a young diver is stranded some 300 feet below the surface in the new film "Last Breath." His umbilical cable has severed. The support vessel above is aimlessly drifting away from the site through violent, stormy waters. And the diver has only ten minutes of oxygen in his backup tank.

As if that wasn't enough, it's also a true story. If merely reading this is giving you heart palpitations already, you can only imagine the white-knuckle experience of watching this all play out on the big screen. It's 40ish minutes of pure suspense and anxiety as the story shuffles between the man at the bottom of the ocean, Chris Lemons (Finn Cole), his fellow



saturation divers (Woody Harrelson as Duncan and Simu Liu as Dave) in the diving bell below the waters who are unable to help and the crew in the support vessel above (including Cliff Curtis and Mark Bonnar) scrambling to get their systems back online and operational as the clock rapidly runs out. Ten minutes has never felt so short — and then it just gets worse as the clock starts counting up, showing Chris's time without oxygen.

At one point, Liu's character Dave, a no-nonsense, all-business diver says matter-of-factly at that it's a body recovery, not a rescue. Deep-sea saturation diving is a dangerous business, described at the start of the film as the most dangerous job on earth. Chris tells his fiancé, in a short introduction, that it's no more dangerous than going to space. She replies that it's funny that he thinks that is comforting.

The real incident happened in September 2012 — Dave, Duncan and Chris were just one team of divers sent to the ocean floor off the coast of Aberdeen, Scotland, to repair oil pipeline.

The seas were particularly rough that day, with winds up to 35 knots, common for the North Sea but also not what one might call safe. Chris and Dave were in the middle of their work when they heard the urgent calls to abort: The dynamic positioning system in the support vessel above had failed and they were in drift. Chris scrambled to maneuver out of the pipeline corridors, but his umbilical got caught. For a brief, awful moment he's the anchor to the ship above, but soon enough the cord snapped, and he was thrown back to the ocean floor in pitch black with no coms, no heat and very little hope for survival. News articles about the incident clock his backup oxygen supply as being closer to five or six minutes - perhaps the movie wanted to give the audience a little buffer.

If this sounds at all familiar, it may be because it was made into a documentary, also called "Last Breath" and released in 2019. While it was well-received, some true stories are just too gripping to exist solely in that form. It's not exactly a surprise that a narrative film was made as well. There's a good track record of recent complimentary adaptations — think Ron Howard's "13 Lives" and "The Rescue" about the Thai boys soccer team stuck in the cave.

This one was made by Alex Parkinson, the same director who co-directed the doc, and it's a well-executed narrative interpretation that doesn't get in its own way with padding. Harrelson gets to be the wise mentor who really doesn't want to lose someone on his last mission. Liu gets to flex his action muscles (literally and figuratively) in a modest but solid role. And they don't go out of their way to shoehorn in a villain — this is just a group of people trying their best to save a life.

The only real problem, if one can even call it that, is that it's so short. The film doesn't take liberties with stretching out the timeline much at all and after 93 minutes, the whole thing is over. It feels strange to want a movie to be longer, but in the case of "Last Breath" I was both desperate for it to end, for anxiety reasons, and also wanting more.



boomer hit man is given a nightmare final assignment to train his own Gen Z replacement in Simon West's lifeless action-comedy "Old Guy." Christoph Waltz's Danny Dolinski is the one at an unwelcome crossroads in the film. He's only partially healed from a hand injury that's rendered him dependent on pills and unable to aim a gun as well as he used to. Dolinski also seems to be in the throes of a full crisis: We meet him not on the job, or even in flashback to his pre-injury glory, but out clubbing. The next morning, Dolinski emerges in a bathrobe to gaze proudly upon the several much younger women who have spent the night.

But a room full of scantily clothed model-types who seem to be there willingly is only a temporary balm for poor Dolinski. While he might still be a viable specimen for the 20-something party girls of London, his game does not hold the same appeal in the workplace. Soon he'll be getting the dreaded "we're going younger" talk from his boss, and she's talking about him, not his love interests. This is a guy who is certain he's got a lot left to give in the assassin game, and not as a mentor to a "hitman prodigy," as Cooper Hoffman's character Wihlborg is described.

Is a familiar conceit like the wise veteran and the cocksure newcomer tired or a classic? Well, it's all in the execution. And "Old Guy," stylishly filmed though it may be, is not one of the better attempts, likely hampered by the script from Greg Johnson. Generational clashes should be easy enough comedic fodder for a screenwriter and two capable actors, but here it lands with a thud. One likes to drink! The other doesn't even like to be around alcohol! The more serious ethical questions about hitman etiquette are similarly inelegant. Take this gem from Wihlborg: "Where I come from one does what one needs to do to survive. That includes killing a kid."

Hoffman, so perfect leading "Licorice Pizza," is not served well by this script, which never quite justifies why he's such a prodigy at such a young age and doesn't give him or Waltz any room to play off one another in a natural way. Waltz also can't seem to choose a lane with Danny, an eccentric hedonist with a soul who doesn't think it's necessary to kill kids on the job. He's also working with his normal accent which is all well and good until the movie very unnecessarily introduces his Irish mother.

And because action movies of this variety need a woman, Lucy Liu, who deserves



much, much better than this (they all do, but mostly her), goes along for the ride. Her character Anata is the glamorous manager of a Soho karaoke bar that might also be a front for a brothel, but that's never really explored. What is deemed important here is that she's Dolinski's longtime confidante, and tags along on their mission to Belfast for...wait for it...a date. It's a very strange little subplot in which Anata does go to this date only to be broken up with. The guy she's been seeing is not connected to the larger plot in any way, except as the narrative push to have her ultimately fall in Dolinski's arms.

West is an action and studio system veteran behind "Con Air," "Lara Croft: Tomb Raider" and various Jason Statham vehicles. There's lots of shoot-em-up action and bullets to the head for anyone looking for that, but not much more to hang on to. "Old Guy" feels very of this moment in the fact that it looks good and has a good cast and yet can't seem to deliver something that's either entertaining or meaningful. But unlike so many of its peers, this one amazingly was not made by a streamer.

RI CAN CREATE VIRTUAL VERSIONS OF YOUR LOVED ONES BUT SHOULD IT?

n an era where artificial intelligence is rapidly transforming, a new frontier is emerging—AI-generated virtual versions of people, including loved ones who have passed away. The concept, once confined to science fiction, is now a reality thanks to advances in machine learning, deepfake technology, and natural language processing.

Companies and researchers are developing AI-driven systems that can replicate voices, mannerisms, and even personalities based on existing data such as videos, voice recordings, text messages, and social media. Emotional Impact on the Living: Interacting with an AI-generated version of a deceased loved one could provide comfort or prolong grief. Some people may find it healing, while others might struggle.

Misuse & Manipulation: As deepfake technology advances, there's a risk that AI-generated versions of people could be used for fraudulent purposes, such as impersonating a person to scam others.







BRAVING BASE JUMPING

The Best Spots To Fly
In Los Angeles & Ventura Counties

nlike more remote and legally accessible locations such as Twin Falls, Idaho (home of the Perrine Bridge), BASE jumping in Los Angeles and Ventura counties is extremely limited.

Most tall buildings and bridges are private or government property, making unauthorized jumps illegal and highly risky.

However, that hasn't stopped a group of elite jumpers from attempting covert jumps in the dead of night or finding creative ways to experience the thrill. Potential (and Risky) BASE Jumping Spots

While we do not condone or encourage illegal activity, here are some locations that have historically attracted BASE jumpers: Downtown Los Angeles Skyscrapers

High-rise buildings in DTLA have been the site of illegal BASE jumps, often under darkness.

The US Bank Tower (1,018 feet) and Aon Center (858 feet) have been infamously targeted, with some successful jumps making headlines.

However, security is tight, and trespassing can lead to legal consequences.

Vincent Thomas Bridge (San Pedro)

One of the most well-known bridges in Southern California, the

Vincent Thomas Bridge has seen its share of BASE jumpers. However, law enforcement is aware of the risks, and any attempts to jump

jumping cliffs like Norway's Kjerag, some remote

cliffs in Malibu have been considered for wingsuit and parachute jumps. However, terrain and access challenges make them dangerous.

Conejo Valley & Santa Susana Mountains

Ventura County's rugged landscapes, particularly in areas like Conejo Valley, Simi Valley, and the Santa Susana Mountains, offer promising cliffs, but most are on private land or protected parkland. Legal and Safety Considerations

BASE jumping in urban environments comes with legal consequences. Many popular jump sites in Los Angeles and Ventura counties are private property or fall under federal/state jurisdiction, meaning trespassing can result in

If you're serious about BASE jumping in Southern California, consider these alternatives:

arrests, fines, or even felony charges.

Permitted Jumps: Some production companies obtain special permits for BASE jumping stunts in films or commercials. Working with these professionals might provide legal access.

Wingsuit & Skydiving Training: If you're looking to build your skills,

Instead of risking legal trouble in LA, many jumpers travel to Bridge Day in West Virginia or the Perrine Bridge in Idaho, where jumps are allowed. Extreme Sports in LA & Ventura

If you're an adrenaline junkie looking for a legal and thrilling alternative, these extreme sports can provide a rush:

Paragliding in Malibu: Launch from the cliffs of Malibu Paragliding School and soar over the coast.

Wingsuit Skydiving in Perris Valley: Train with experts at Skydive Perris, where experienced skydivers can practice wingsuit techniques.

Bungee Jumping at the Bridge to Nowhere: This classic thrill, operated by Bungee America, offers the closest legal experience to a BASE jump.

Helicopter Skydiving: Take a heli-jump with experienced skydivers at Skydive Coastal California.

BASE jumping is one of the most extreme sports in existence, and while Los Angeles and Ventura counties offer an incredible backdrop, legal restrictions make it nearly impossible for jumpers to practice here without significant risks. However, for those seeking an adrenaline rush, the region provides plenty of legal alternatives, from skydiving and paragliding to bungee jumping and wingsuit training.

For those who dream of BASE jumping, the best bet is to train, get the right experience, and travel to places where the sport is legal and safe. After all, the ultimate goal is to enjoy the thrill—and live to tell the tale.





Looking for love? If you're in Dodauer Forest in northern Germany, you're in luck. The Associated Press reported on March 4 about the Bridegroom's Oak, a 500-year-old tree that has served as a mailbox for the lovelorn for over a century. The custom originated with a couple whose relationship was opposed by the woman's father; they left messages for each other in the tree's knothole and eventually married in 1892. Here's how it works: People send a letter (address: Brautigamseiche, Dodauer Forest, 23701 Eutin, Germany), and the postmaster delivers it to the tree. Visitors can climb a 10-foot ladder to retrieve a few letters, leaf through them and choose a pen pal. "The resulting pen pal relationships have even led to a few marriages," noted the postal service.

Bright Idea

James Coxall, 42, of Castle Camps, a village in Cambridgeshire, England, was sick of driving around -- and sometimes driving into -- an 8-foot-long, 4-inch-deep pothole that had been in the road for more than a year, The Washington Post reported. So Coxall, a carpenter, repurposed a pair of jeans his daughter had grown out of, filling the legs with wood and old shirts and attaching some shoes at the hems. Then he fashioned an anchor to hold the contraption upright -- or upside down, as it were -- and put it in the pothole, so that it looked like someone was head-down in the hole. He thought it might spur some action on the hole, and indeed, on Feb. 27, the county filled the hole. "They fixed the hole," Coxall said. "They just got another several million to do in Cambridgeshire."

Surprise!

Dean Harrison and two of his friends were fishing on his open-top boat on Feb. 28 when a 900-pound bottlenose dolphin crashed onto the 16-foot vessel, the Associated Press reported. The men were along the far north coast of New Zealand's North Island when they saw dolphins playing nearby. "This one decided to jump on board and say hello," Harrison said. The 11-foot-long dolphin's wild movements snapped "every single fishing rod we had in the boat," Harrison said, and severely damaged the bow. The animal was stuck, so

the men alerted New Zealand's conservation agency, which directed them to a boat ramp an hour away. While they motored toward help, they kept the dolphin wet with a hose and a towel. At the ramp, members of the Maori tribe prayed for the dolphin, which they named Tohu, which means "sign." Harrison has also renamed his boat Tohu.

Questionable Judgment

Newsweek reported on March 5 that a Reddit post has blown up. The post details a stunt that landed a man and his brother-in-law in small claims court over medical bills of more than \$2,000. While the poster was napping in a hammock with his shirt off, his BIL filled his navel with super glue, he said. When he awoke, the glue was dry, and he was hesitant to aggressively try to remove it because of scars from an earlier gall bladder surgery. The BIL "thought it was funny right up until we left for the emergency room," the poster wrote. But after the BIL wouldn't cover his medical bills, the poster won in court. "This has caused a major rift in my family," he wrote. "My wife is upset, and her family thinks I overreacted." But Redditers are on his side: "This was straight-up malicious. This wasn't a prank," one wrote.

CTV News reported that three framed paintings were stolen from St. Andrew's Church in Little Steeping, England, on Feb. 23. One was a painting of the Lord's Prayer; the second depicted Moses delivering the Ten Commandments; and the third illustrated the commandments -- including "Thou Shalt Not Steal." While the church was unclear about the value of the paintings, they held "sentimental" value to the parishioners.

Li Zhang, a professor of physiology and neuroscience at the University of Southern California, has authored a study showing that laboratory mice would leap into action to help their companions who were incapacitated, NPR reported on March 2. Their behavior included biting the unconscious mouse, biting its tongue and licking its eyes -- and "eventually pulling the tongue out of the mouth of this unconscious one" to clear its airway, Zhang said. The response was much stronger for mice that had been caged together for a long time, he said.
